Interpretation


- Aspergillus fumigatus IgM antibody ELISA test has been used for detection and quantitative determination of specific IgM antibodies against Aspergillus fumigatus in serum and plasma.
- Generally, infections with Aspergillus species are air borne. Because of ubiquity of Aspergillus spp. it renders more difficult to decide between contamination, colonization and serious infection, so patient history and other tests should be taken into account.
- Clinical specificity and clinical sensitivity of test is 99% and 100% respectively.
